Criteria for Creating a Major World Peace Rose Garden

International World Peace Rose Gardens receives many requests to create World Peace Rose Gardens from around the world and has developed the following criteria for consideration by potential host cities:

1. The host city would provide a site that has cultural, historic and/or sacred significance for its people, as well as international importance. There cannot be more than 2 major World Peace Rose Gardens in one state (USA) or country (outside of USA).
2. The site will have high visibility and be accessible to visitors.
3. The garden will have a marker/sign identifying it as a World Peace Rose Garden.
4. The garden needs to be maintained after its completion. Identified personnel/volunteers would be willing to be trained in advanced rose care technology by "TJ, The Rose Man," Co-Creator of IWPRG.
5. Host city is responsible for identifying supporters and donors to fund the project, if not able to fund the project itself.
6. A liaison would be appointed to work with IWPRG in identifying schools/groups to participate in the youth programs.

Criteria for Creating a Sister or Affiliated World Peace Rose Garden

International World Peace Rose Gardens (IWPRG) has developed the following criteria to encourage cities to become a Sister or Affiliated garden:

1. The host city/entity would provide a site that is open and accessible to the public.
2. A Sister garden would embrace the theme of one of IWPRG's major World Peace Rose Gardens; e.g., the ideals of nonviolence, peace and love (the Martin Luther King, Jr. WPRG).
3. An Affiliated garden would have its own theme related to peace.
4. The Sister or Affiliated garden is welcome to implement the Inspirational Messages of Peace Contest, the "World Peace Begins with Me" Art Program, or other youth programs of IWPRG.
5. IWPRG will provide guidance and technical support for the development of the project, as well as rose-growing technologies, if requested.
6. The garden will have a marker/sign identifying it as an official Affiliated World Peace Rose Garden or a Sister garden of one of IWPRG's major World Peace Rose Gardens.
7. The host city/entity will be responsible for the cost and maintenance of the garden.
